- Community and culture


#### GAMBELL

- 10,000 reindeer loss only 100 remained






## **BUCKLAND ROS EVENT 1968**




## GAMBELL ROS EVENT 1943




#### Gambell - Nov 6, 1943



#### Buckland - Jan 26, 1968






# IMPORTANCE
